Letter to the Fellowship

Wearing What God Provides

By the time you read this article, GCSES and A levels results must have been declared by then. Some happy, contented, people and

some not that content with their progress in education. I heard some students saying, "the bad or late results have ruined the dreams and purposes of their lives". Really? Heard one saying, if he had a choice, he would have followed his own dreams after finishing compulsory school education.

Each of us is called by our Creator God to fulfil our purpose in life. Each of us is given gifts and talents to use for the glory of God. Yet, how many of us are tempted to wear life-clothes that we know won't fit.

A mother tries to encourage her daughter to wear a stethoscope because being a physician has excellent career opportunities. "Look at the prestige and security of graduating from medical school," she says. "You've got the brains so make the best of them." But what the daughter would really like to try on is the Speedo of a competitive Olympic swimmer.

A father goes out and buys his son a complete set of cricket equipment from spikes to helmet. "You'd make a great cricket player, son. Why, when I was your age, I wish that I'd had the chances that you have." But the son really isn't interested in wearing cricket whites. What he'd really like to wear is an actor's costume on stage in the musical that the school is putting on. This, however, is not part of his father's dream.

A husband wants his wife to wear an apron and stay in the kitchen. Isn't that, after all, where women belong? Their job is to look after the kids and clean the house. She doesn't know how to tell him that what she would like to do is to go to college to study theology. She feels called to ministry and what she would really like to wear is a preaching stole.

A wife wants her husband to wear a business suit and move up the corporate ladder. She knows that he has the potential so she pushes him up one wrung at a time no matter how much overtime it takes. But what he really feels called to do is work with the children of his community. He'd like to be able to take off his business suit after a long day at the office and put on a Scout leader's uniform. That is what he really feels called to do.

Society tells its citizens through advertising and the mass media that we are all supposed to wear the clothing of successful people. We are supposed to make lots of money and buy lots of possessions. But most people with whom I speak are less concerned about wearing success then they are about wearing a smile.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if more people could be simply content and happy with their lives and families? Wouldn't the world be a very different place if we took off the trappings of success and put more value on a happy face.

God wants us to be happy and the only way to be truly content in life is to live the life that God would have us live, to wear the clothes that God would have us wear and do the things that God would have us do.

We know the story of David and Goliath. David slays the Philistine giant Goliath and saves the Israelite nation. He does it with a sling shot and a sharp stone which fells the mighty warrior in his tracks and enables David to slice off his head.

But before the climax of the story, there is another subplot. After David accepted Goliath's challenge, King Saul tried to make him look and act like a soldier. He tried to dress him in armour and give him a sword and shield. But David was a mere boy, a young shepherd. The sword was too big. The armour was too heavy. David could not even walk in this stuff let alone fight in it.

He took off the clumsy soldier's armour and went to find the things that were more familiar to him. "He took his shepherd's stick and then picked up five smooth stones from the stream and put them in his bag. With his sling ready, he went out to meet Goliath." (1 Sam. 12:40) The rest is history.

David was given all of the things that a soldier needed to defeat Goliath. But David wasn't a soldier. He was a shepherd. He didn't fit into soldier's clothing. They simply weren't who he was. He was a shepherd and, if he was going to win the battle, it would have to be as a shepherd. David wore what fit him and he succeeded.

There is, perhaps, a lesson here for us. Maybe it goes something like this. If we want to fulfil God's purpose for our lives, then we should wear the clothes that God provides for us.

There are always people who will want to tell us what we should do with our lives and how we should live. Often those people are the very ones who are closest to us. In the end, however, we will only follow our true path by listening to God's voice and wearing the clothes that God lays out for us.

Use of our church premises is beginning to pick up a little, and we were able to answer an SOS from the Little Heroes support group who had arranged an 'inflatables' fun day for outdoors but the weather forecast was not good, so it was moved into our hall. This is just the kind of thing we would want the church to be doing so if you know of any charitable organisations in need of space please do put them in touch with Roger. For the time being we are not hiring out the hall for children's parties as we have been unable to find a volunteer to co-ordinate that and arrange to open and close the premises.

In July we took a coach party to the Synod Big Day Out at Ipswich. It was one of the hottest days of the year and many people felt unable to be out all day, so numbers were not as big as hoped. Nevertheless, a good time was had and it was worth doing.

On 17th August some of us joined the Garrard family at the Crematorium and Cliffs Pavilion to say goodbye and celebrate Mark's life. I was privileged to read the Scripture - St Paul's hymn to love which was very apt. If you know anyone with Downs' syndrome you cannot fail to appreciate their capacity to love without any of the inhibitions many of us exhibit. And Mark's love of music was celebrated with tunes from Kylie Minogue and Abba - Thank You for

On the 19th we had our first Fun Day since 2019 on a sporty theme to follow the recent Commonwealth Games, and the European Championships taking place at the time. 
