#### Letter to the Fellowship

#### Making the Right Choice

Most Christians today, on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2023 around the world celebrated Ash Wednesday. It is the beginning of a significant season for

us Christians; Lent - a time of solemnity and self-reflection where we confess our failings and resolve to live a more godly life based on the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Lent is a journey to the cross: meditating on our sin and weakness, looking to Jesus as our perfect example and substitute, and being heightened in our worship of his victory over Satan, sin, and death. On the cross, Jesus took our place to appease God's righteous anger toward our sin and rebellion.

I think many of us are living too comfortably. God doesn't save us from our sin so that we can sit guilt-free in church on Sundays and lead stationary lives. He saves us so we can minister to and share love with others. If the goal of our lives as Christians is to become more Christ-like, then the mission of our lives should be the same as Jesus' mission. His mission is to save people.

I wonder if non-believers would stop doubting organized religion if we lived the way we're called to live. Christians are good at telling people we'll pray for them. We're good at interacting with our church friends. But what are we doing to actually reach out? Are we seeking the lost or just hoping they'll show up on our doorstep begging for help someday? All around us, people are drowning as they look for answers. We have the answer.

It is true that God may have called us to be exactly where we are. But it is absolutely vital to grasp that he didn't call us there so we could settle in and live our life in comfort and superficial peace. We often let the world tell us how to live, but what does the world really know about living? So many lives are filled with deception, distraction, selfishness, and chaos. Do we really want to fit into what the world dictates as "normal"? Shouldn't we be passionately sharing the love, grace, peace and forgiveness of Christ with a world that so desperately needs it?

Maybe we're scared. Maybe we doubt our individual abilities. Maybe we don't feel personally "called" to this mission. Maybe we're too busy chasing things that ultimately don't matter to notice what's going on around us. Maybe we forget that our lives are not supposed to be about us. Maybe we fail to realize that just because we're on the same side as everyone else, that doesn't mean we're on the right side. Maybe we trust God enough to let Him save us, but not enough to let Him use us for the work He prepared for us.

As we go through our Lenten journey, we need to consider what direction is it leading us. That direction is towards Jesus. He deserves to be the centre of our lives and He's calling us to live for more than just our own happiness. We also know that there is no greater joy than the joy that comes from loving others.

The most amazing and overwhelming truth in our lives is that God doesn't have to save us, but He chooses to. He doesn't have to love us, but He chooses to. He doesn't have to forgive us, but He chooses to. He doesn't need us, but He reaches for us. We have choices too. We can choose to walk with God, or not. We can choose to love those around us, or not. We can choose to follow the world, or we can choose to follow Him.

May this Lenten journey help us to make the right choice. Amen.

- 5<sup>th</sup> John Amos who took 'the Beatitudes' as his theme, starting with commenting that the disciples *came* to Jesus, and asking why we have come to church today? John went on to say that each of the Beatitudes could be considered an attitude or mindset we can choose to adopt.
- 6<sup>th</sup> Messy Church, followed up the theme of What Would Jesus Do? I have been told that at least one little boy is wearing his bracelet to pre-school! Do you wear yours?
- 12<sup>th</sup> Sohail reminded us that we are to be salt and light for the world; when salt becomes tasteless it is of no use, thus we need to continually return to Jesus to refresh and renew our faith in order to be effective in mission
- 19<sup>th</sup> Roger's theme was the transfiguration of Jesus, an experience so powerful that the apostle Peter wrote about it many years later. What do we do to share our experiences of God? When someone asks what did you do at the weekend, do you reply 'I went up the mountain to listen to the Lord'?
- 26<sup>th</sup> Sohail drew our attention to the Lenten course that we have just started, "Talking Jesus", and asked if we were

ready to start spreading The Gospel of Jesus? Then, we had a time to be challenged as we met around The Lord's Table.

The Warm Space continued through February and will go on until the end of March. Take up has not been huge, except on the Monday of half term when several families were present. Nevertheless, I believe it was the right thing to do, and we have been able to have some good conversations; I am grateful for the support of our Minister, along with Alison and Rob, each week.
